## Implement new technologies

### Visualising social distancing

Existing CAD models or 3D laser scanning – to produce a virtual replica of the factory's spatial dimensions

Increasing the number of people returning to work off-site

Simulation software and artificial intelligence – these can also help rapidly plan staff shifts and determine the materials required

Sharing information and imposing social distancing

Infrared range-finding equipment – to measure distances Voice control – to enable hands-free technology use Augmented reality – to annotate tangible objects and capture processes

> Controlling the movement of people and stream of materials

Remote process control and visualisation – to manage facilities, and carry out analysis and supervision

Tracking the movement of people and materials

We arable devices – to monitor staff and alert them when they're within  $\mbox{ 2m of}$  another person

Radio-frequency identification tags – to monitor cleaning Thermal imaging – to detect heat radiation and potentially sense if team

members have a fever

#### Helpful hint:

Enforce a one-way or traffic light system for walkways and passages

#### Helpful hint:

Temporarily close nonessential areas, like a canteen
